FRIEND OF MANY OMAHANS

Dr. William Ellery Copeland, Who Dies in Washington, Pioneer Nebraska Minister.

The death of Dr. William Ellery Copeland at Burley, Wash., which became known in Omaha through the publication of the death notice Wednesday by The Bee, will strike a friend from the list of many Omaha people. Dr. Copeland was for ten years or more minister of Unity church and was very popular, especially among the labor union men and members of secret societies. His death occurred very suddenly March 28, from a stroke of apoplexy. He was doing some work about his home and died in a few minutes. Twenty years ago he was one of the most popular of Omaha divines. He was here for a few days during the Transmississippi expedition and preached to a large congregation in Unity church. He was at one time grand chancellor of the Knights of Pythias in this domain. The notice of his death was printed in western papers with the request for eastern papers to copy.
