Changes at Anamosa Prison.

Warden W. A. Hunter of the Anamosa prison was recently reappointed for four years, his record in the prison for eight years being the very best. This week Deputy Warden Z. C. Gurley of the prison resigned, and his daughter, Mrs. Waterman, matron of the women's department, also resigned. Gurley's place was taken by Assistant Deputy Smith, who was in turn succeeded by Guard Lowe, both appointments being promotions.

Escape from Reform School.

For the first time in many years the Industrial school for Girls, or State Reform school, at Mitchellville, has to record the escape of three of the inmates. Last night about midnight they quietly took their departure from the school. As there is little but moral suasion to restrain the girls, and guards and fences and such things are dispensed with, there was no difficulty in the girls getting away. Those who escaped were Edna Russell of Sheldon, aged 17, and Hattie Shepherd of Muscatine, aged 18. The three removed a cold air register from their room and slid down through the opening in the basement of the cottage, thence leaving through a window. In this way they got away without anyone suspecting their absence until morning.
