Overflows Its Banks at Northwestern Tracks and Broadway.

THAT SECTION OF THE CITY FLOODED

Sewers Unable to Carry Water from Hill Streets and Portion of Upper Broadway is Also Inundated.

As a result of the heavy rain yesterday afternoon Indian Creek went on one of its periodical rampages and shortly after 4 o'clock overflowed its banks at the Northwestern bridges. Here the water poured onto Broadway like a mill race, and it took but a short while to flood the street from curb to curb between Tenth street and the Illinois Central tracks.
