INDIAN WOMEN COME TO SCHOOL

Two Arrive in San Francisco Looking for Education in America.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 9.—Two young women, natives of India, in search of education as they expect to find it in America, arrived here today from the Orient on the liner Coptic. They are the Misses Ethel and Nora Maya Das and are daughters of a high caste East Indian, who holds a high commission in the British army.

The young women expect to enter some eastern college, but have made no selection yet. They go from here to Boston, where they will remain until they find a college which will accept the girls upon their educational qualifications.

They speak English and are both well versed in the mysteries of Sanskrit and Pehlavi. Of Latin and Greek, however, they have no knowledge, and Rev. Mr. Hatch fears that without this knowledge they may have some difficulty in securing admission to the kind of college they desire.

They come here as students, but hope to return to India as full-fledged missionaries.
