SATOLLI IN BALTIMORE

LIVELY MARKET FOR COTTON

July Option Advances Forty-Five Points on Active Buying at New York. NEW YORK, June 11.—The cotton market was active and excited today, such as the trade grew accustomed to last summer. The cotton was 49 1/2 cents and December 107 1/2 cents. These prices represented a net gain from the low level of the week since last Monday of about 140 points on July and of 60 to 70 points on the new crop months. The close was steady at a net gain of 18 1/2 points.

TRAIN ROBBERS SURROUNDED

Men Who Took Cash from Rio Grande Must Swim to Escape. GLENWOOD SPRINGS, Colo., June 11.—Sheriff Adams has returned here and reported that the Denver & Rio Grande train robbers are completely surrounded in a patch of brush at the east side of the junction of Divide creek and the Grand river. A posse of 100 deputies were plying the robbers and were confident of belief that it was impossible for the men to escape except by swimming the Grand river. An attempt to do that, he said, seemed almost certain death, as the river at that point is nearly half a mile wide and has a tremendous current.

TRACKS ARE OUT IN KANSAS

Cottonwood River Rises, Doing Much Damage in Neighborhood of Emporia. KANSAS CITY, June 11.—A special to the Star from Emporia, Kan., says that the Cottonwood river here is still rising and is only two feet lower than during the unprecedented flow last June, when many farms in the vicinity were flooded with water over the first floors of houses. Many of these farms are again inundated. The Missouri, Kansas & Texas tracks south of here have been washed out and the indications are that no trains on that road will reach Emporia for several days. Several rural mail routes have been abandoned because of the high water.

NEBRASKAN STEAMS WITH OIL

Vessel Bearing Good Name Makes Record from New York to Golden Gate. SAN FRANCISCO, June 11.—Ninety thousand barrels of oil were consumed as fuel in bringing the freight steamer Nebraska to port from New York. The trip occupied fifty-two days and ten hours. The oil burning appliances were never out of order. This is looked upon as a remarkable feat in view of the fact that the voyage of the Nebraska is the longest ever made by a vessel dependent wholly upon oil for fuel.
