### **GREEN OBJECTS TO TAXES**

Former President Beal Estate Exchange Protests o : Paying Them.

CITY TREASURER HENNINGS WRITES HIM

Tells Departed Citison Assessment Was Based on His Own Statement Signed Before He Left.

Concerning the sum of \$21.58, due the city in personal taxes, W. H. Green, now manager of a bix Mexican sugar plantation, and City Treasurer Hennings have had a brisk exchange of compliments. Mr. Green is indignant that he should be called upon to pay 1904 taxes when he left the city March 14 while Mr. Hennings points out that he has the law on ais side and declares it bad grace for Mr. Green to protest against taxes in a city where he made his fortune.

Mr. Green was formerly president of the Real Estate exchange and was classed among the men of that body who made the fight for more equitable taxation during the last few years.

This is Mr. Green's letter: This is Mr. Green's letter:

LA CRUZ, Tamnuispas, Mex., June & 1904.—Mr. A. H. Hennings, Omaha, Neb.: Dear Sir—Your two postals sent to my old residence in Omaha, giving the amount of my personal taxes as \$1.55, were received here at my new home today.

I was always aware that the tax department of Neuraska would tax a man's estate as long as he had anything to collect from after his death, but I did not know that if a man paid his taxes and moved away trom the state, — in fact, out of the United States, that he was compelied to continue paying personal taxes.

I moved away from Omaha on March 14.
Tou had made no levy at that time and I cannot conceive how you can assess a personal tax against me when I do not live in the United States.
