

GREEN OBJECTS TO TAXES

Former President Real Estate Exchange Protests on Paying Them.

CITY TREASURER HENNING'S WRITES HIM

Tells Departed Citizen Assessment Was Based on His Own Statement Signed Before He Left.

Concerning the sum of \$2,000, due the city in personal taxes, W. H. Green, now manager of a big Mexican sugar plantation, and City Treasurer Hennings have had a brisk exchange of compliments. Mr. Green is indignant that he should be called upon to pay 1904 taxes when he left the city March 14, while Mr. Hennings points out that he has the law on his side and declares it had grown for Mr. Green to protest against taxes in a city where he made his fortune.

Mr. Green was formerly president of the Real Estate exchange and was classed among the dead of that body who made the fight for more equitable taxation during the last few years.

This is Mr. Green's letter: LA CRUZ, Tamaulipas, Mex., June 4, 1904.—Mr. A. H. Hennings, Omaha, Neb.: Dear Sir—Your two postals sent to my old residence in Omaha, giving the amount of my personal taxes as \$2,000, were received here at my new home today.

I was always aware that the tax department of Nebraska would tax a man's estate as long as he had anything to collect from and his death, but I did not know that if a man paid his taxes and moved away from the state, in fact, out of the United States, that he was compelled to continue paying personal taxes.

I moved away from Omaha on March 14, 1904, and made no levy at that time and I cannot conceive how you can assess a personal tax against me when I do not live in the United States.

If you have any way of making this perpetual I would like to know it, so that I can prepare for it. Very truly yours, W. H. GREEN.

Mr. Hennings' reply: This is Mr. Hennings' reply: OMAHA, June 10, 1904.—Mr. W. H. Green, La Cruz, Tamaulipas, Mex.: Dear Sir—Very sorry to hear of your departure from Omaha, but I am very much surprised that the president of the Omaha Real Estate exchange is not acquainted with the revenue laws of the state of Nebraska.

You state in your letter that when you left the city on March 14, 1904, no levy had been made, while under the law the levy was made on the first Tuesday in February, 1904.

You signed the schedule yourself and you made a sworn return to October 20, 1903. Mr. William F. Hennings, state commissioner, based the assessment on your own figures.

Mr. Knicker, I don't see where you have any kick coming. You have become wealthy in Omaha, you have been honored by our most influential organization, the Real Estate exchange, and it comes with poor grace after looking in a new country to knock against Omaha, your old home, its officials and the laws of our state.

I am sorry to say that it will be impossible for me to make you pay your 1904 personal taxes at the present time, but they will remain on the books, will draw 1 per cent per month interest, and will be collected at some future time when you make up your mind that Omaha is a pretty good place after all and return to this city. 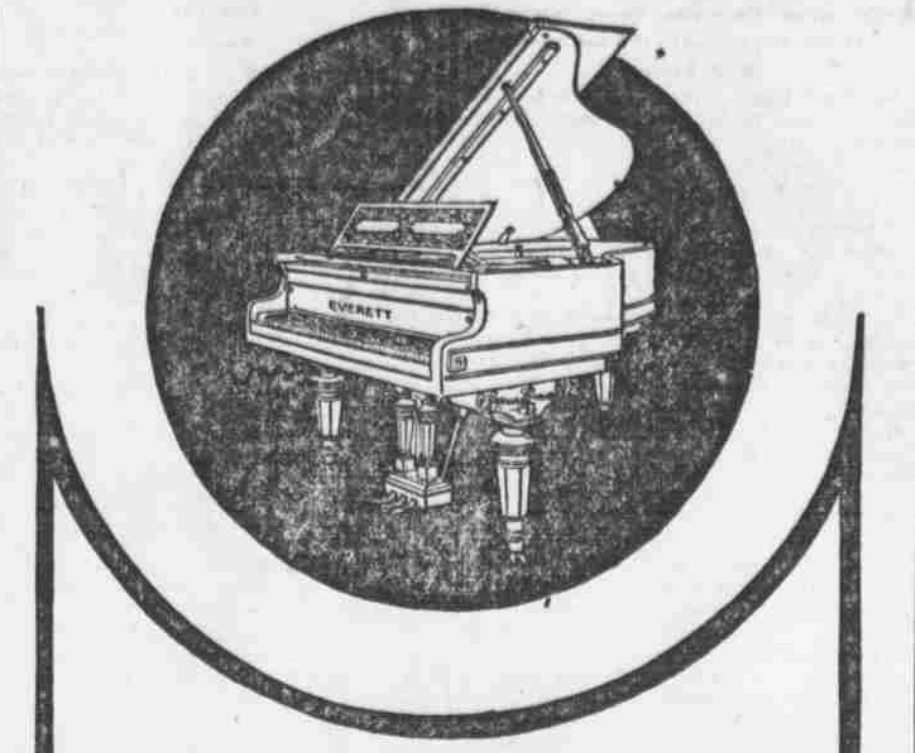
