The revived popularity of the Tam O'Shanter, with the reported increased manufacture of this favorite headgear in the United States, has led Nottingham hosiery makers to put in extra machinery for its production. Organizers of the Knights of Labor are at work in Philadelphia in an effort to restore the numerical strength of the order, and it is reported that they are meeting with con-siderable success, especially in the textile trades.

After six years of experiments the officers of the street railroad company at Chillicothe, O., have decided that the women conductors must go. The women were satisfactory except that they were not strong enough for switching work.
