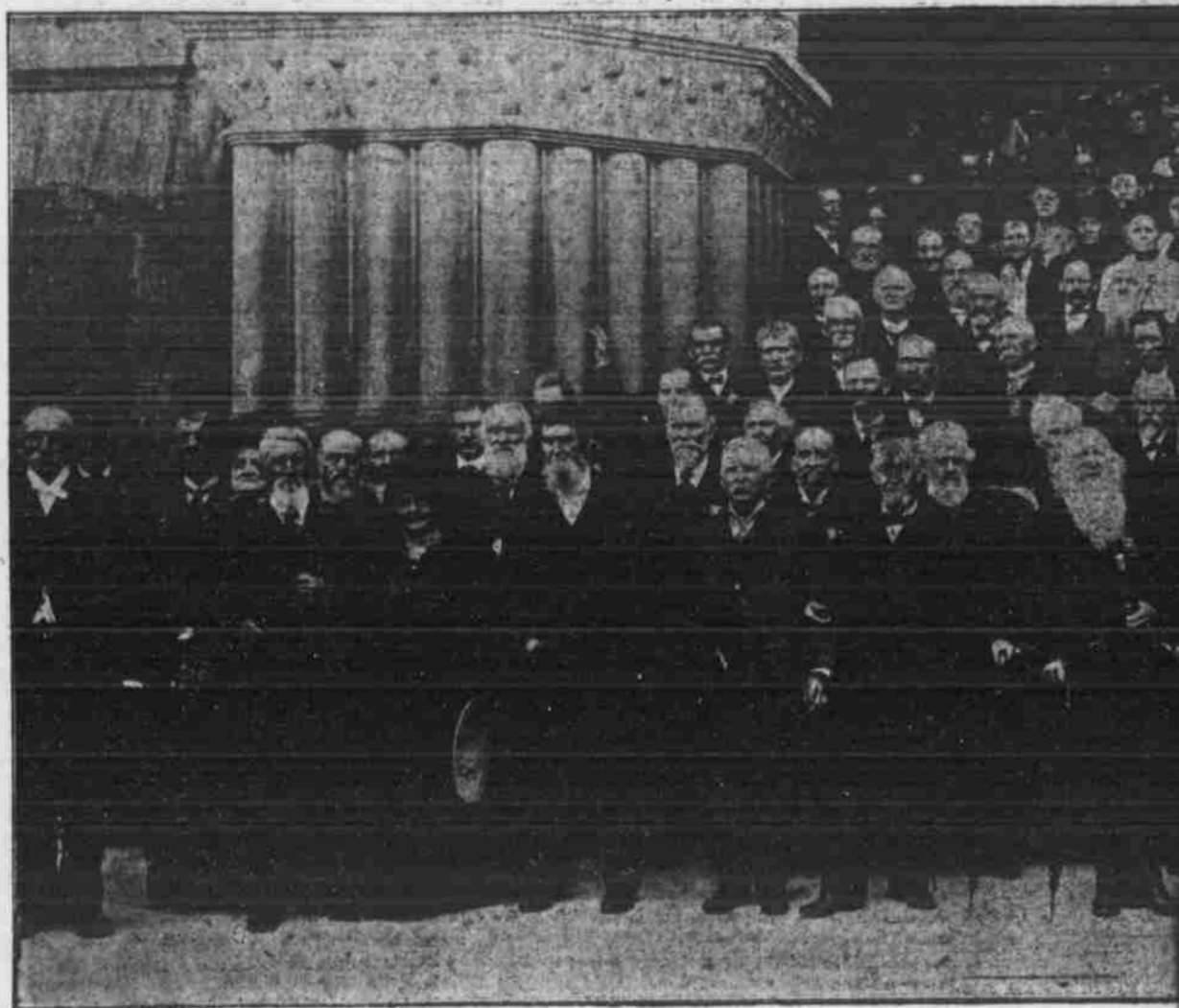


Nebraska's Observation of the Semi-Centennial Anniversary of the Passage of the Nebraska-Kansas Bill

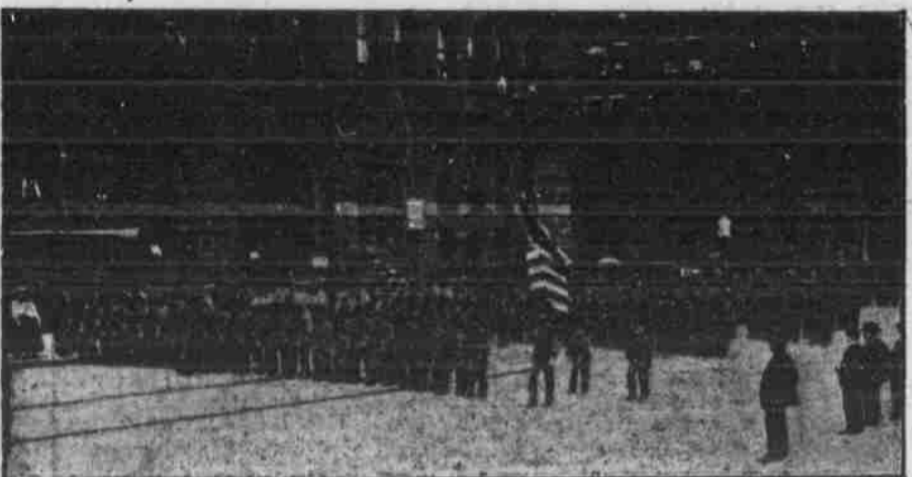

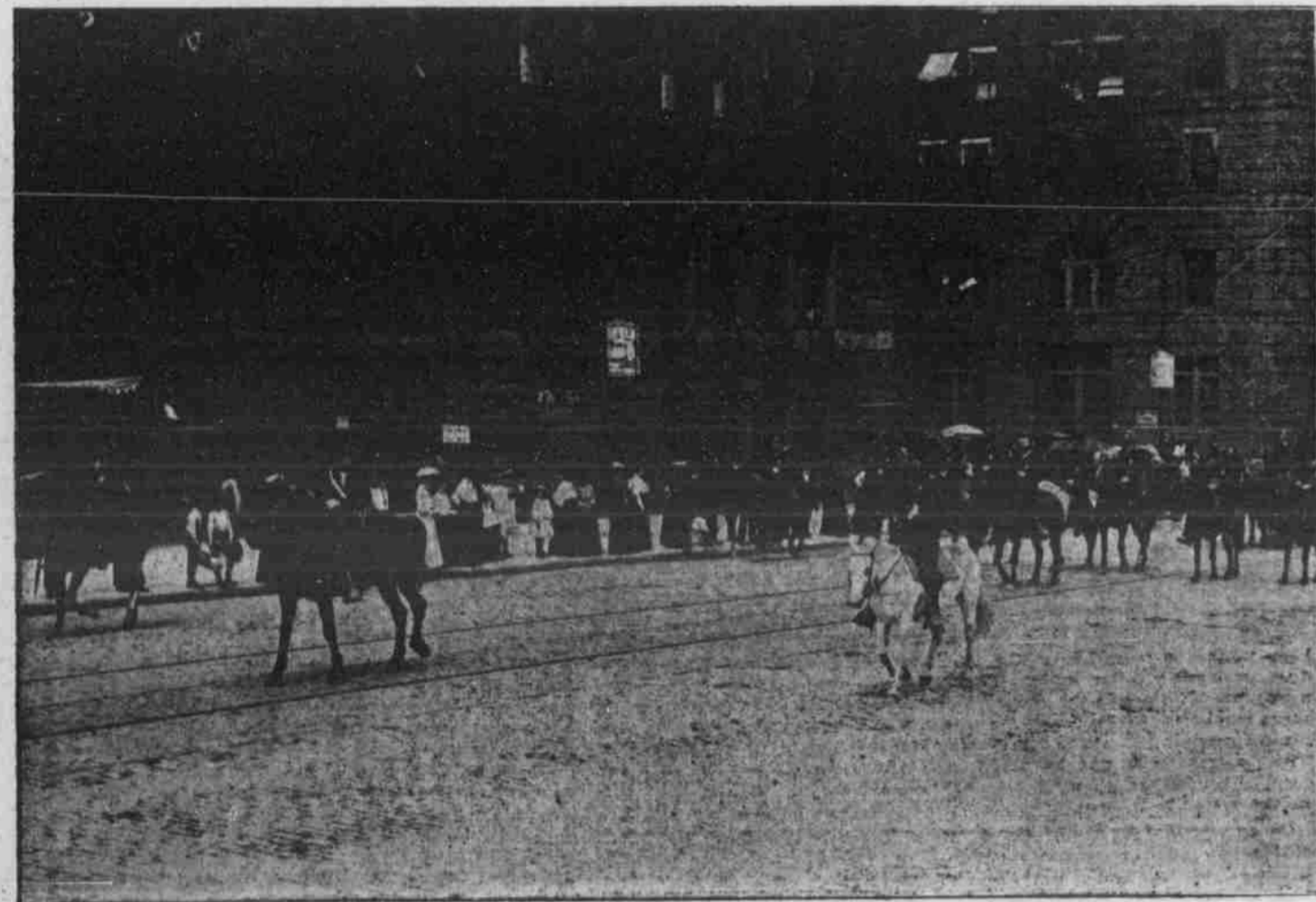

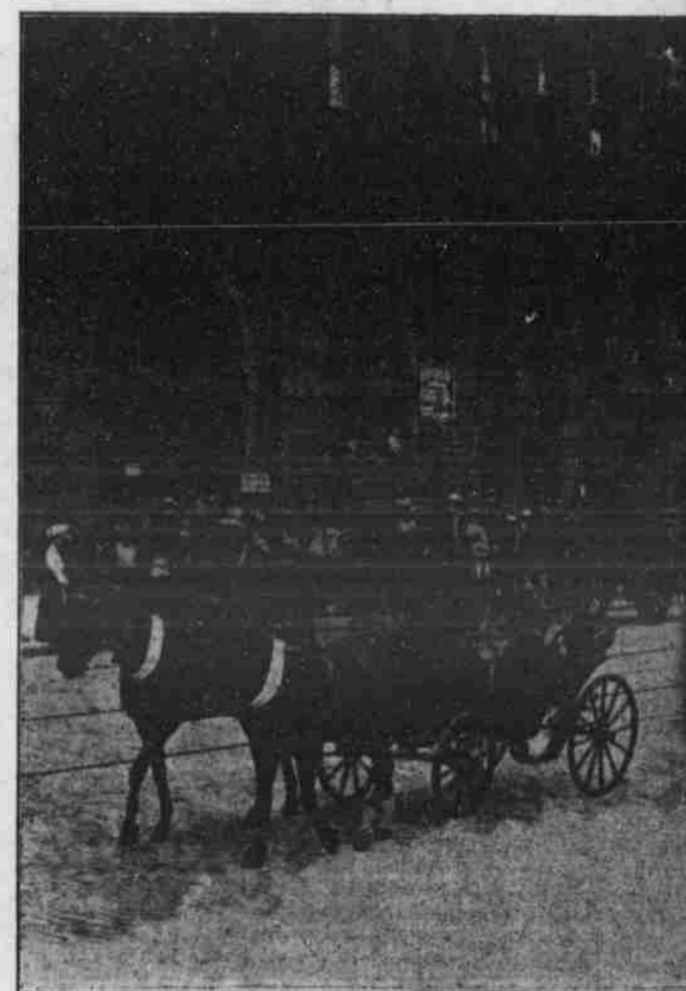
