SIOUX CITY, July 1.—(Special Telegram.)

—Omaha won over the Sioux today in a ball game which only took on appearance of life when the Omaha men jumped onto Kosta's curvas and straightened them out all over the lot and made four runs in the seventh inning. The final score was 6 to 2. The game started out with Companion in the box for the visitors, but while stopping a hot liner of J. Spindler Metzoff in the sixth of the game split his hand and retired from the game. Pfeister took his place and during the seven innings made the unknowns be good.

When the game started it looked well for the Sioux City team. The team was playing snappy ball and full of ginger. Kosta kept Pa. 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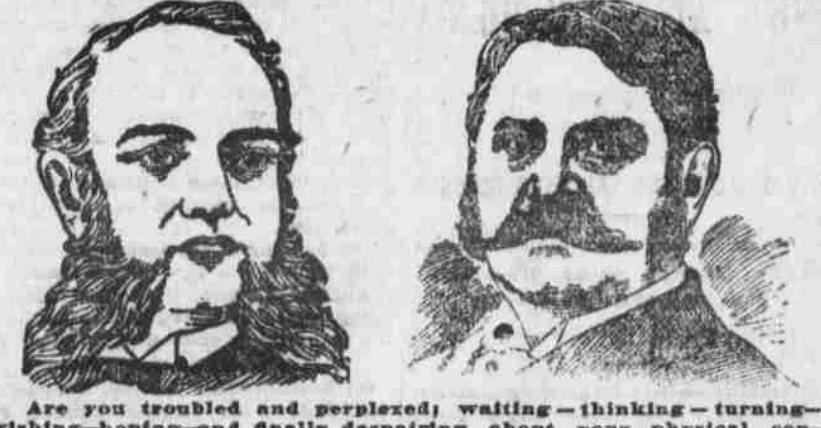
