Interesting Information Regarding Old-Time Schools and School Books.

TRAITS OF MASTER AND PUPIL

"The Philippines and the Far East," by Homer C. Stuntz, Gives a Comprehensive Account of Conditions on the Islands.

"Old-Time Schools and School Books," by Clifton Johnson. The author gives much interesting information regarding old-time schools and school books in England and the first schools in America.

The author of a geography publication of 1894 ventured to teach science in poetry. Speaking of himself in the third person in the introduction the author said: "Unpracticed in poetry in a great degree, he has ventured thereupon supposing it to be in general rather more taking with youth than prose; and though not the most flowery cast, it will, he hopes, answer the end."

"Two Arcanists in Spain," by Jerome Hart. This book is a series of newsy letters, written in a light vein. The author says: "The reader will find in these pages nothing about religion, revolution or politics."

"An Evans of Suffolk," by Anna Parquhar (L. C. Page & Co.), is a novel written somewhat like one of the "problem stories," but it is not. It tells of a girl who marries a second time, but forgets to tell her husband that she is a widow with a more than questionable father.

"Hemming, the Adventurer," by Theodore Roberts (L. C. Page & Co.), is good for a summer day's reading simply. It requires neither thought to follow the plot nor does it jar on the sensibilities. It is a tale of an English officer who becomes a special correspondent and after experiences in South Africa returns to London.

"Tomfoolery," by James Montgomery Flagg, text and illustrations (the publishing company). Those classical gems of the funny page which are known as "Limericks" flourish here in abundance. The illustrations fit the text and the text fits the occasion.

A revision of "Twenty-Eight Years in Wall Street," by Henry Clews, is from the press of the J. S. Ogilvie Publishing Company. This is the sixth edition of the work, and in it the author has brought his review of men and methods of "the street" up to date.

"The Woman Wins," by Robert Barr. This book is a collection of sketches each having a woman as the central figure and in each one she has her "hearty desire."

The Burr exhibition at the St. Louis exposition has aroused renewed interest in the story of Aaron Burr and Charles Felton Fildes' untiring efforts, through his Burr novels, to remove from his name the stigma placed there by historians.

"Kings and Queens I Have Known," by Helene Vacaresco. The author, a lady-in-waiting to Queen Elizabeth of Roumania, records in this book her impressions of her mistress and many other crowned heads of Europe.

"Austro-Hungarian Life in Town and Country," by Francis H. E. Palmer, is a book full of comprehensive information of the people of whom it treats.
