Interesting Information Regarding Old-Time Schools and School Books.

TRAITS OF MASTER AND PUPIL

"The Philippines and the Far East," by Homer C. Stunts, Gives a Comprehensive Account of Conditions on the Islands.

"Old-Time Schools and School Books," by Clifton Johnson. The author gives much interesting information regarding old-time schools and school books in England and the first schools in America. There are extracts and illustrations from the books, and the author calls attention to some of the common traits of character of master and pupil of those times. The trials and discouragements were many, not only for the master and pupil, but for the parents, who provided the school house, fuel, etc. There are many illustrations collected by the author, probably one of the most suggestive being an inkstand, a sandbox and a bunch of uncut quills. Scripture was taught in many of the books. A feature of one of the primers that perhaps aroused most attention was an illustration depicting the burning of John Rogers at the stake, with his wife and ten children looking on. The author says: "Every youthful primer owner counted those children to make sure the statement of the text as to their number was correct." The author of a geography publication of 1804 ventured to teach that science in poetry. Speaking of himself in the third person in the introduction the author said: "Unpracticed in poetry in a great degree, he has ventured thereupon supposing it to be in general rather more taking with youth than prose; and though not the most flowery cast, it will, he hopes, answers the end," The following is an excerpt from the "poetry":

"One river of enormous size
To west of Mississippi lies,
The river this call'd Missouri,
And tow'rd southeast its courses lie,
This river, from what I can see,
Can't less than the Ohlo be."

Even arithmetic was taught in poetry, as shown by the following "sum": "If to my age there added be, One-half, one-third and three times three, Six score and ten the sum will be; What is my age, pray show it me?"

The problems were sometimes intensely practical, for instance: "Divide 4% gallons of brandy equally among 144 soldiers." The answer is: "One gill apiece." Published by The Macmillan Co.

"Two Argonauts in Spain," by Jerome Hart. This book is a series of newsy letters, written in a light vein. The author says: "The reader will find in these pages nothing about religion, revolution or politics." They were first published in the San Francisco Argonaut. There are many interesting descriptions of Spanish peculiarities, the theaters, opera, circuses, etc., and there are numerous full page illustrations. Published by Payot, Upham & Co.

"The Philippines and the Far East," by Homer C. Stuntz. The author, a missionary of the Methodist church, intensely zealous and practical, gives in this book a comprehensive account of conditions past and present in the Philippines. It deals with the friar question, the resources of the islands, the government situation, missionary and educational difficulties, international relations, finance, etc. Mr. Stuntz is entirely optimistin. He believes that a great deal has been accomplished in the islands and is very convincing in his arguments. The author presents the facts, as seen by him, in a thoughtful and intelligent manner, and a careful reader will have an increased interest in our little brother, the Filipino. Published by Jennings & Pyc.

"An Evans of Suffolk," by Anna Farquhar (L. C. Page & Co.), is a novel written somewhat like one of the "problem stories," but it is not. It tells of a girl who marries a second time, but forgets to tell her husband that she is a widow with a more than questionable father. The father appears as an anarchist, and falling to kill the husband, commits suicide. The story comes out and the end is peace all around. What there is of it is well told.

"Hemming, the Adventurer," by Theodore Roberts (L. C. Page & Co.), is good for a summer day's reading simply. It requires neither thought to follow the plot nor does it jar on the sensibilities. It is a tale of an English officer who becomes a special correspondent and after experiences in South Africa and a few other out of the way stops in the world returns to London, conventionality and the woman whose action drove him away.


