Wheat Soars at Chicago, but July Drop 3 Cents a Bushel Here

30,000 BUSHELS WHEAT DELIVERED TODAY

This Makes 60,000 Bushels Tendered Out of Shortage of Probable 150,000 Bushels—Farmers Expresses Saturday.

OMAHA, July 19.—Chicago executives are about as much in the wheat market as ever before. Thursday the bears were in clover and having a world of fun at the expense of the bulls. At the close September wheat was up 14¢ and previous day 16¢. Settlement in the wheat pit was decidedly against the bulls, starting as the result of an upward trend in the part of the market above 70¢. The reaction, however, was short lived. About the same time damage reports from the southwest and northwest began coming in, which put a stop to the wheat market's shorts. On the hinge that followed September advanced to 74¢, but part of the gains were lost on resistance to 73¢. The market, however, closed with September at 73¢ 15¢. Clearances of wheat and flour were equal to 73,000 bushels. The price of wheat was 73¢ 15¢. Primary receipts were 16,000 bushels, compared with 10,000 bushels a year ago. Secondary receipts of 220 cars, against 50 last week and 187 a year ago. The price of wheat was the main factor affecting the wheat market. The market closed near the high point of the day. September opened unchanged to its higher level, but the bulls had a hard time holding it. The price of wheat fell to 73¢ 15¢. Local receipts were 100 cars, with 21 of contract grade. The feature in trading in wheat was the large number of contracts that confirm all his bullish talk of the season. All in all, there was no change without the assumption that the market appeared to have had a bad effect on the bears and they turned buyers, moving prices up faster than they went down. The market was in trouble, but a bunch of July shorts still in trouble and then orders were levered toward topsy-turvy. The price of wheat was predicting more and demand was unabated and predictions were made that the original bulls would end up with the market. Local receipts were 100 cars, with 21 of contract grade. The market subsequently was quiet and firms September opened unchanged to a shade lower. The market closed near the high point of the day. September advanced to 73¢ 15¢ and closed at 73¢ 15¢. Local receipts were 50 cars. Provisions took on fair strength. At the close the market was 73¢ 15¢, up 10¢ each. Wheat was up 7¢ at 73¢ 15¢. Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 100 cars; flour, 100 cars; oats, 100 cars; hogs, 1,000 bushels. Farmers were tendered today and the delivery will terminate on time of expiration at 12 m. Saturday.

The question of opening the inspection books to members was discussed and some parties made written demands on the chief grain inspector for permission to look over the records.

Estimated futures of December and September responded to the advance in the Chicago markets with gains of 1¢ point. The local market presented no new or different news. The local market was in no way affected. The only price up to 1 o'clock was 11 cents, where one trade was made. The market was 73¢ 15¢, up 10¢ each. Wheat was up 7¢ at 73¢ 15¢. Estimated receipts for tomorrow: Wheat, 100 cars; flour, 100 cars; oats, 100 cars; hogs, 1,000 bushels. There was nothing doing in either corn or oats.
