#### **GOVERNMENT HAS BRIDGE CASE** War Department Considering Brief of Attorney Against St. Louis Combination.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4-The brief of Attorney General Edward C. Crow of Misouri in the matter of the control of the Merchants and Eads bridges at St. Louis reached the War department today. The attorney general began action against the ompanies in the state courts with a view of breaking up what is asserted to be a nonopoly in restraint of trade, but the ourt held that these corporations were n the nature of terminal companies and herefore not subject to the provisions of the law on consolidations of railroads. Therefore the attorney general has had recourse to the national government and has appealed to the War department to act, as that department is directly charged by congress with responsibility for the construction and operation of bridges over navigable streams.

Judge Advocate General Davis has been following the case very glosely and went to Missouri to attend the session of the state ourt when it was argued. Therefore he is in position to make an early report upon the matter to Secretary Taft who will decids whether or not the United States goveroment shall proceed against the bridge companies. If he decides in the affirmative the papers will be sent to the attorney general to take legal proceedings in the federal court. The interests involved are
