Even "Our Dave" Says He is Not Sure of Baldwin's Candidature.

HITCHCOCK WORKING FOR THE LATTER

Battle Ground Between Kennedy and Gurley in Fourth and Ninth Wards, Homes of Both and Blackburns.

The preliminary canvass for the republican congressional primary, which is to be held next Saturday, already is showing some interesting developments.

"Everybody interested in the congressional content," declared a Fontainebleau club man, "admits that the battle ground will be in the Fourth and Ninth wards between Gurley and Kennedy."

Inspection of the lists of filings for congressional delegates shows that the old lines of machine and anti-machine have been badly broken across.

Congressman G. M. Hitchcock, who enjoys the distinction of being the only democratic member of the house from Nebraska, is being distinguished by his eagerness to have Gurley win out.

The federal building is filled with a Gurley bunch, but that is easily accounted for when it is known that Senator Millard is exerting himself to line up all the federal officials subject to him for John N. Baldwin's candidacy.

Of course, Senator Millard is not doing all the work for Gurley personally. The senatorial prestige is being drawn upon chiefly through his private secretary, J. B. Haynes, who has been rounding up the minor federal employees and telling them that the senator will be elected.
