JUSTICES OF PEACE FIGHT

Altstadt and Bachman Come to Blows After Some Words.

OUTGROWTH OF OLD ILL- FEELING

Altstadt Goes to Justice Baldwin's Court to Swear Out Complaint, but the Judge is Not In.

A recent unpleasantness between Acting Police Judge C. M. Bachman and Justice of the Peace William Altstadt, who have adjoining offices in the Paxton block, came to a head about 10:30 Friday morning at the foot of the Paxton block stairway, where the men met and exchanged a few passages of arms.

Justice Altstadt and Constables J. J. Casey and E. W. McGinnis had just emerged from the elevator and Justice of the Peace Bachman was returning from police court with Attorney E. P. Morearty. Angry words were passed between Altstadt and Bachman, followed by several blows. Attorney J. J. Boucher separated the combatants and the incident was closed for the time being.

Constable Casey and McGinnis accompanied Justice Altstadt to a nearby store where the blood was washed from Mr. Altstadt's face, his left cheek having been slightly cut with Judge Bachman's ring, so it is alleged. Then the three went to Justice of the Peace Bachman's office in the Paxton block to file a complaint of assault with intent to do great bodily injury against Mr. Bachman. Justice Baldwin was not in at the time. Judge Altstadt then announced that he would file a complaint in the county court.

Each Man Makes Statement.

Justice Altstadt gives the following version of the affair: "Bachman met me in the Paxton block entrance and said: 'Now, you little Dutch fellow, you will talk about me?' then he struck at me two times before I could do anything. I never said anything disrespectful of Mr. Bachman. I do not know what he could have thought I said about him."

Constable Casey, who was a witness of the affair, confirms Mr. Altstadt's statement.

Acting Police Judge Bachman had this to say when asked for a statement: "The fact of the matter is Mr. Altstadt and I have not spoken since our appointments as justices of the peace until this morning. Last evening Constable McGinnis came to me and said Altstadt told him he was going to take a punch at me and lay me up for three days. Mr. Altstadt has been doing all he could to antagonize me, particularly since I was appointed acting police judge during the absence of Judge Becka. When we met this morning I said to him: 'If you have anything to say at or about me I wish you would say it to my face and not behind my back.' Then he struck me and I merely pushed him away."
