TESTS OF A MAGNETIC BRAKE Notable Invention by Which Little Pieces of Iron Do the Work

an inventor whose invention is more than likely to make both himself and the town famous. His name is John S. Lockwood, and the product of his inventive genius is a magnetic brake for use on everything that runs on wheels.

The brake was given a third and final

test by the Metropolitan last week and a

highly successful test it was. The car, equipped with Mr. Lockwood's invention, started out from the barn at Ninth and Washington streets, and hit a merry clip for the steep grades out in the south part of the city. People on the streets must have thought it a trolley party, for the car was packed to overflowing with excited and enthuslastic stockholders in the Lockwood ven-

ture. Mr. Charles Fritz, the Metropolitan's chief electrician, was acting as motorman and Mr. Lockwood and his assistants made capable hosts. The car wound its way out Troost ave nue to the race track, returning by the Holmes street line, a route that took in goodly number of steep descents. Every variety of stop was made with the magnette brake, each one quickly and surely. Not even when the stop was most instantaneous did the passengers experience the slightest jolt, and the absence of grinding

wheels and groaning rods almost led to the bellef that the car had stopped of its s one of its greatest advantages. There is no great mass of metal, no complicated system of cogs and wheels. A couple of iron shoes, about the size of a man's hand, resting a quarter of an inch above the tance from the wheels, did the work. It almost defied imagination to look at those small pieces of iron and grasp the fact

that through them the heavy car could The principle of the invention is also simple enough; that is, after Mr. Lockwood explained it. Any iron bar coiled with insulated copper wire through which an electric current can be made to flow, instantly becomes a magnet, and attracts iron, steel or anything of a similar nature. Around this idea the Lockwood brake is built. A core of iron, wrapped with copper wire, and incased in a castiron jacket, is suspended between the trucks about a quarter of inch above the rails. In the jacket there are two separate and listinct magnets, the lower giving magnetic effect at the rail, the upper operating on plunger, thereby setting the wheel brakes. Both are operated simultaneously, however, the motorman having complete control of
