DISTRESS WARRANTS SERVED

Hundreds of Them Sent Out by County Treasurer Plank for Personal Taxes.
The office of the county treasurer has served several hundred distress warrants. Considerable opposition is being met from people who do not seem to realize they must, under the new revenue law, pay their personal taxes. Treasurer Plank is loath to take action in many cases where the delinquent is in a poor condition financially and has a number of years' back taxes to pay. Mr. Plank has, however, not chosen under the law. The county is not getting much furniture shown county personal taxes which might be disposed of by public sale. The delinquents, when they find there is no escape, have, as a rule, far paid the amount of the tax and retained their chattels.
