Thirty-Three Republicans Register for Twelve Legislative Places.

SIX FOR SENATE, TWENTY-SIX FOR HOUSE

Ballots Closed Last Night with Liberal Number of Aspirants for Each Office to Be Filled This Fall.

Filing of the names of candidates for the republican primaries closed last night, the ruling of Secretary Tuttle of the county committee being to permit them after 12 o'clock noon.
