PLEADS TO HAVE NAME ON CITY TICKET

Certificate of Nomination Not Enough to Convince Him that Weller Won Out at the Primaries.

R. B. Howell, the Fontanelle candidate for member of the Water Board who was so decisively defeated at the primaries by C. F. Weller, and T. W. Blackburn, deposed chairman of the congressional committee...

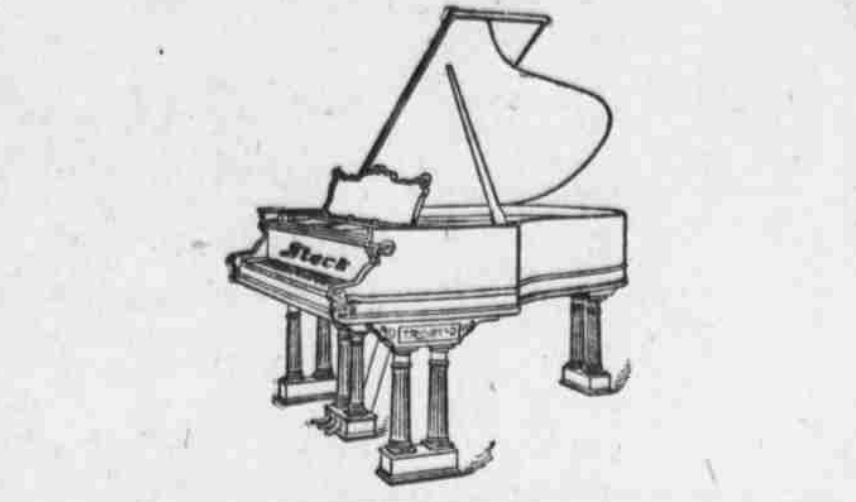

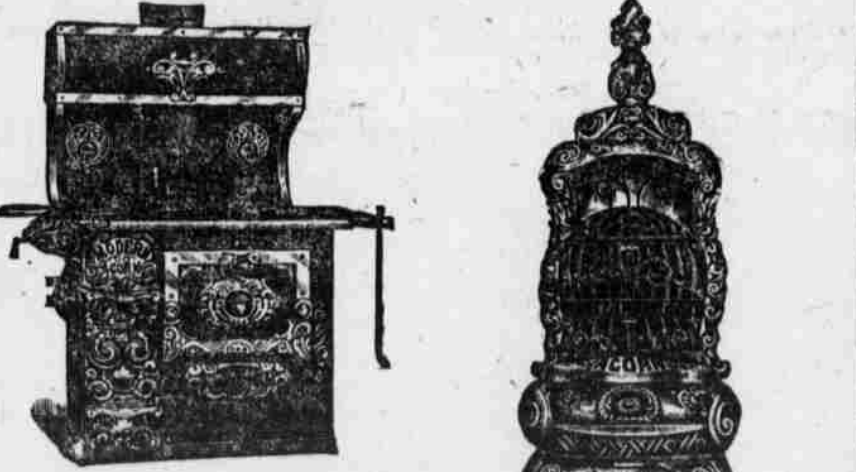

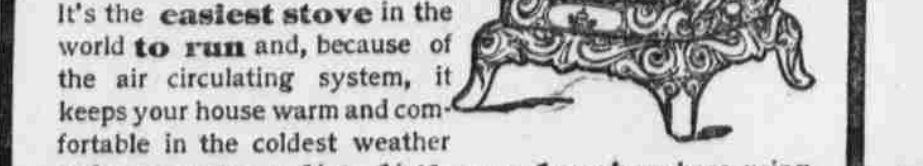
