HOWELL TRIES SMALL TRICK

Waterlogged Statesman Seeks to Influence City Clerk Elbourn.

PLEADS TO HAVE NAME ON CITY TICKET

Certificate of Nomination Not Enough to Convince Him that Wel-Ier Won Out at the Primaries.

R. B. Howell, the Fontanelle candidate for member of the Water board who was so decisively defeated at the primaries by C. F. Weller, and T. W. Blackburn, deposed chairman of the congressional committee and one of the chief medicine men in the Fontanelle wigwam, tried methods anything but nice to have City Clerk Elbourn put Howell's name on the city bal-

lot in place of Weller's. The effort was made Tuesday, after it was apparent that the canvassing committee would not declare the election, or part of it, vold and give Howell a chance to appear as a republican candidate. Howell and Blackburn went to the city clerk and pleaded with him to disregard the certificate filed by the officers of the republican city central committee to the effect that Mr. Weller is the duly qualified nominee. They based their pleadings on the assertion that the primaries were fraudulent because the order of the candidate's names had been reversed from the alphabetical in several wards.

City Clerk Elbourn, who has always been classed with the "anti-machine" faction, laughed loud and long.

"What kind of an official do you think I am?" he asked the pair. "Do you suppose that I am going to disregard the certificate of the regular committee merely because you want me to do so? I shall not do it, by any means. All that I have before me to act upon is this certificate and until another is filed or I am served with a court order forbidding me to do so it is the only name that will go on the official city ballot as republican nominee for member of the water board."


