Russians Reach Paris. PARIS, Nov. 2.—Three officers of the Russian squadron, including Captain Clardro, who are the principal Russian witnesses in the North sea incident, arrived today from Vigo and went immediately to the Russian embassy, where they held a lengthy confidential conference.

Captain Clardro was on board the flagship with Admiral Rojestvensky and was entrusted with the task of drafting the official account. After the conference the officials declined to make any public statement relative to the affair until the report is delivered in St. Petersburg.

VERDICT IN HULL INQUEST

Jury Finds that Fishermen Are Slain by Shots from Russian Warships. FIRING IS AT VERY SHORT RANGE. Trawler Only Quarter of a Mile from Cruisers When the Shooting Began—Fishermen Think It a Sham Battle.

HULL, England, Nov. 2.—That George Henry Smith and William Legg were, at about 12:30 a. m. on October 25, while out fishing with trawls aboard the British steam trawler Crane, who with board of trade marks exhibited and regulation lights burning, killed by shots fired without warning or provocation from certain Russian war vessels at a distance of about a quarter of a mile.

Great Interest in Proceedings. St. George's hall, a large auditorium, which had been specially fitted up for the occasion, was quite inadequate to accommodate the crowd that wished to listen to the evidence. The interest was intense and there was some excitement, but no demonstration occurred.

The proceedings occupied only about three hours. The testimony consisted of medical evidence by which it was proved that the death of Smith and Legg was the result of shell and machine gun wounds; then an expert identified fragments of shells by private marks which he said were undoubtedly Russian, and the stories of captains and crew members of the British trawler related that while they were engaged in their regular work the ships of the Baltic fleet in two squadrons emerged suddenly from the haze, and throwing the glare of their searchlights on the Gamecock fleet, without warning and without any preliminary lights, the fishermen's signal, and though within actual speaking distance of one vessel, commenced a cannonade, which the fishermen at first, not realising the danger, enjoyed, thinking it was a sham fight.

STOCKMAN IS PROBABLY MURDERED. Body Not Yet Found, but Indications Point to the Mabels. STURGIS, S. D., Nov. 2.—(Special Telegram.)—James Garrett, the stockman who disappeared suddenly a short time ago near the Cave Hills country, is now said to have been murdered. It is reported that a suspect in the killing of Garrett was at Belle Fourche. Much indignation has been aroused and feeling is very high. Garrett's body has not yet been found.

TESTIMONY IN DETAIL. The first witness described the nature of the wounds as gunshot wounds made by Colonel Jocelyn Thompson, chief inspector of explosives, said the shells which struck the vessels were of Russian origin. He expressed the opinion that the shells which damaged the trawler Mino were fired at a range of not exceeding a quarter of a mile.
