SIGNS OF AN EARLY BATTLE

Mukden Reports Sharp but Short Engagements of the Belligerents.

TOKIO HEARS RUMOR OF A VICTORY

Unconfirmed Report to Effect that Japanese Have Captured Important Defense of Port Arthur is Received.

MUKDEN, Nov. 5.—The uninterrupted activity conspicuous between the opposing positions, that on the plain and on Hung-pao hill, occupied by the Japanese, and on Mannon hill, named after a Russian general, daily threatens a formidable outbreak.

Occasional casualties are reported at Pienchiap on account of its exposed position, as the apex of a wedge used against the Japanese right. At the Shapoh station a water tank which the Japanese are using as a watch tower, from which the Russian artillery has fallen, after an attack lasting more than a fortnight to dis-

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5.—Official Washington was absorbed in one topic today, in the closing hours of the presidential campaign—the reply of President Roosevelt to Judge Alton B. Parker, the democratic candidate for the presidency.

The president will leave here next Monday night for Oyster Bay. He will be accompanied by Secretary Loeb and several White House attaches, who, with the president, will visit in Oyster Bay at 10:15 a. m. and is scheduled to leave there at 11 o'clock. The president will arrive here about 6:30 o'clock Tuesday evening.
