QUEER ESCAPE FROM DEATH

Girl Falls from Window of Flying Train and Damage Suit is Brought.

Charles Huggart, a conductor on the Union Pacific, running out of Pocatello, Idaho, is in Omaha on his way to Indianapolis, where he has been called as a witness in a damage suit brought against the Pullman Car Company.

"The suit grows out of a very peculiar occurrence," said Mr. Huggart, "and I do not know very much about it for the amount sued for. But I was in charge of the passenger train that produced the incident which is the foundation of the matter."

"One evening last summer the train was traveling through the mountains at about sixty miles an hour. Most of the sleeping car berths had been made up and the passengers had retired. I was sitting in an unoccupied berth checking up my tickets when a woman screamed. She was in great distress and we had some difficulty in ascertaining the trouble. She finally informed us her 12-year-old daughter had a habit of walking in her sleep and had managed to crawl out of the window. We thought the girl had merely got into the wrong berth or something of that kind, but as she could not be found, concluded that after all the woman might be correct. She declared she had told the porter to put a screen in the window, fearing just such an accident."

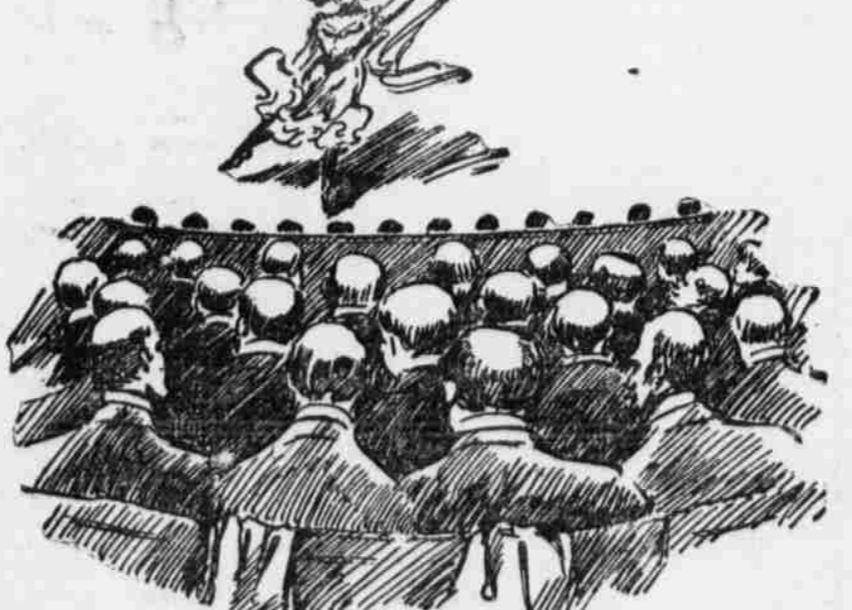

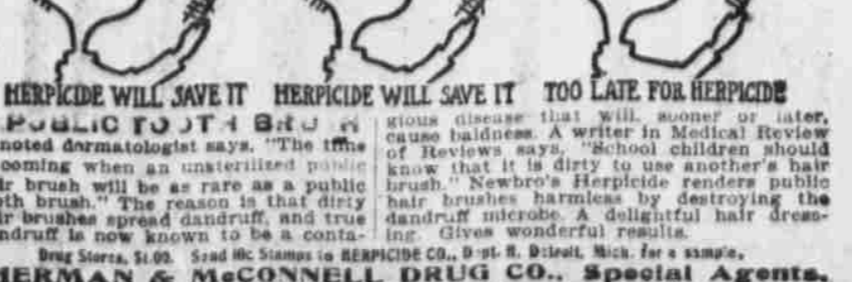

HARRIMAN ROADS MAKE GAIN

Union Pacific, Oregon Short Line and R. & N. Earnings Increased.

COMPROLLER MAHL ISSUES HIS REPORT

C. L. Mills Goes from Illinois Central in Omaha to Eastern Territory with Headquarters in New York.

William Mahl, comptroller of the Harriman railroad system, has issued his report of transportation operations on three of the principal lines controlled by the syndicate. These are the Union Pacific, the Oregon Short Line and the Oregon Railway & Navigation company. The statement shows separately the operations for the month of September and the three months previous.

The number of miles of road operated in 1934, showing an increase of 11.31 over 1933, when the number of miles operated was 3,985.53 for the same month. The gross receipts for September, 1934, were \$3,427,553.21. For 1933 they were \$3,132,544.99, an increase of \$295,008.22. The expenses for the same period of 1934 were \$2,505,461.90. For 1933 they were \$2,417,232.89, showing an increase over 1933 of \$88,229.01.

The increase, both in the receipts and expenses, tell their own story of the prosperity of the times. The increased expenses are explained as being due largely to advances in wages.

The number of miles operated over the three roads for the three months ending

September 30, 1934, was 5,377.18. For 1933 the number of miles operated for the same period was 5,377.55, showing a decrease of 20.37 for 1934. The gross receipts for the same period were \$14,906,520.85. For 1933 they were \$14,306,538.68, an increase for 1934 of \$599,982.17. The expenses, including taxes, for the same period were \$7,818,057.52. For 1933 they were \$7,632,691.52, showing an increase for 1934 of \$185,366.00.

Mills Goes Up a Notch.
A banquet given in the new dining hall of the Calumet Saturday evening is the sequel to a series of changes which go into effect on the Illinois Central Tuesday. The banquet was given in honor of the departure of C. L. Mills, city ticket agent for the road. Mr. Mills goes to New York to take the position of traveling passenger agent for the company and his jurisdiction will extend from New York to Virginia.

Mr. Mills has been with the Omaha office of the company for three years and during his residence here has made hosts of warm friends, who will regret to have him go, although with the regret is mingled the congratulations of those who are pleased at the promotion which they feel Mr. Mills is entitled to by force of merit. His friends also feel that his genial and ingenious personality qualify him for the duties which he will assume in his new position in the east. Saturday this magnificent of their kindly regard was shown in the entertainment, which was engineered by J. N. Neely, secretary of the Omaha and Council Bluffs Passenger bureau. This organization is a branch of the Western Passenger association and has a representative from every railroad passenger department in the city.

Mr. Mills came here from Waterloo, Ia. He will be succeeded in the local office by R. R. Rose, who for the last three years has filled the position of chief clerk under District Passenger Agent Brill. Mr. Rose came here from St. Joseph, where he was employed in the auditing department of the St. Joe & Grand Island road. He has been in the railroad service about six years and is thoroughly familiar with the inside duties of the office. The new chief clerk will be John O. Linton, who comes here from St. Joseph, where he has been employed in the Union station.

Advisory Board Election.
Burlington employees are being notified of the election of the advisory board for the relief fund department and which is to take place November 21. Very often there is considerable rivalry in the selection of these officers, but it is understood there is no strong competition this time. While many office men are selected, this is not the rule, as conductors and other outside men become candidates for the places, although their election is not always a walkaway. The purposes of the organization is to provide an insurance fund for the employees of the Burlington, which protects the men against accident, sickness and death. While it partakes of the nature of an insurance, it is fraternal in character and purely co-operative.
