Russian Vessels Disguised. The Daily Telegraph's correspondent at Port Said asserts that the Russian volunteer steamer Voronezh, which passed the Dardanelles as a transport, has three submarine boats on board.

Port Arthur Ready to Surrender. The correspondent at Moscow of the Daily Telegraph claims authority for the statement that General Stoessel's dispatch sent by the torpedo boat Rastoropyia informed Emperor Nicholas that the Port Arthur garrison was being starved out.

News from the Front. TOKYO, Nov. 24.—A p. m.—Telegraphing today the headquarters of the army before Port Arthur reports: The conflagration in the buildings near the arsenal, caused by our naval guns, which is reported to have begun about noon November 23, continued until 2 o'clock on the morning of November 24. It is probable that the coal stores have been burned.

Colored Preacher Waits for Queen. Elder George Gaines, formerly pastor of the church on Eleventh and Webster, and now presiding elder of the Iowa district, arrived in Chicago, headed a delegation which went last night to the Union depot to meet the "Queen of the South" on the coast and which was expected to have among its passengers their way to Washington.

Rev. Harrison Reinstated. ST. PAUL, Nov. 24.—The Pioneer Press tomorrow will say: Word was received yesterday in St. Paul that Rev. John T. Harrison, former pastor of St. Joseph's parish, has won his appeal to the holy see at Rome, and that an order has been issued to Archbishop Ireland to reinstate Rev. Harrison to the priesthood.

TAKES MEMORIAL TO CZAR

Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky Goes to Palace with Zemstvo's Request. POSITION OF MINISTER IS DELICATE. Attacks by Opposing Interests Cause Him to Suppress Two Newspapers Which Disagree with His Policy.

ST. PETERSBURG, Nov. 24.—Interior Minister Sviatopolk-Mirsky went to Tsarskoe Selo today to present the zemstvo's memorial to Emperor Nicholas. The situation is extremely delicate.

Two incidents have occurred, both of which militate against the liberals and increase the difficulty of Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky's position. Prince Mestchikov, editor of the Grashdanin, who is head of the reactionary press, has written to the minister, attacking the interior minister in such a fashion for his liberal tendencies that Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky for the first time since he assumed the ministry ordered the confiscation of the issue.

THE DUTY of all friends of a liberal regime is to uphold and sustain Prince Sviatopolk-Mirsky in every possible way. His retirement would be a disaster to the country.

STATEMENT BY VALENTINE

President of Iron Molders' Union Talks of the Alleged Conspiracy. SAYS HE NEVER HEARD OF PAUHAUSER. Prosecution Anticipates Some Difficulty in Sustaining Charges Against Him—Second Explosion at Eureka Plant.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 24.—President Joseph F. Valentine of the Iron Molders Union of North America, who was arrested in Cleveland on a warrant sworn out by President Gosiger of the Eureka Foundry company, on the charge of aiding and abetting in the maidless abduction of the young girl, was in Cincinnati tonight accompanied by Detective Callahan.
