

HOWARD KENNEDY ON BENCH

Successor to Judge Bartlett Takes Oath of Office as Judge of District Court. Judge Howard Kennedy, jr., has taken the oath of office which binds him as a member of the district bench in Douglas county. The oath was administered Friday evening at 5 o'clock in the office of the clerk of the district court. Mr. Kennedy received his certificate of election from Lincoln yesterday. He was in that city Saturday getting his commission and will assume the judicial position Monday morning. He will take, temporarily, court room No. 2, which is vacated by the retirement of Judge Bartlett.

The court did not decide that Mrs. Haaker's firm had a prior right to the name "Regent." On the contrary, the court specifically stated that we had the right to manufacture and sell Regent shoes and so mark our product.

What the court did decide was that we could not use the trade name Regent Shoe Manufacturing company, as our corporate name, but the right to manufacture and sell Regent shoes was not involved, and, accordingly, we expect to manufacture Regent shoes and sell same as such. An appeal has been taken from the decree in the district court denying our right to use the trade name Regent Shoe Manufacturing company, to the supreme court, with the right upon our part to use our trade name until the final determination of the case.
