GLIMPSE OF CITY'S FINANCES

Investigation Promises to Show Details in Which Public is Interested.

FUNDS SWELLED BY SCAVENGER SALES

City Hall Officials Say Footing Up Will Reveal Heavier Expenditures Than Have Been Made in Single Year.

An investigation of money received and spent by the city during the last year, now being made by a committee of the Omaha Real Estate exchange, is expected to develop some interesting facts in municipal finances. It will, it is said, show among other things that the effect of the scavenger law has been to swell every regular fund above the maximum amount levied for and in some cases above the charter limit, and that this money has all been paid out for various things.

It is expected by city hall officers that when the total expenditures are footed up they will be greater by far than ever before made in the city of Omaha for a single year. Although the levy was high (4 1/2 mills) and nearly every fund was levied to almost the maximum, still the incoming cash from current tax collections was insufficient. Instead of using the volume of back taxes forced into the treasury by the impending scavenger law to pay off old scores and thus reduce the city's running expenses by paying off debts bearing 7 per cent interest, all the money in sight has been seized upon by the council just as soon as available.

Repairs to Unpaved Streets.

It is said the amount of repairs to unpaved streets and alleys and grading has been far more than ever done by the city in a previous year. The street cleaning has cost \$28,000, whereas during the exposition year it was handled for \$28,000. Charges are made that job after job of grading was done at the city's expense whereas half of cost should have been charged up to abutting property owners.

The statement has been made that out of every dollar collected for taxes in the city 20 cents from it goes to pay interest charges on debts.

The following table shows the legal limit to each fund, the amount levied for the year 1904 by the council and the amount of money that has actually been available from each fund:
