Federal Judge Tells Summers and Slean putting the post in good condition would go They Insult the Court.

Counsel for Henry Guitar, Alleged Murderer of Father, Seek to Prove Him Not an

Indian.

W. S. Summers and T. J. Sloan, attorneys for Henry Guitar, Indian, and alleged murderer of his father, Stephen Guitar, were sharply rebuked in federal court yesterday by Judge Carland, who told them their questioning of a certain witness was an insult to the intelligence of the court

and would not be tolerated. A half-breed Indian by the name of Carey La Flesche, was on the witness stand. The attorneys for the defense sought to prove by La Flesche that Guitar was not an Indian and made some inquiries of the witness as to the allotment laws. Immediately District Attorney Baxter interposed an objection.

"And the objection is further sustained from the fact that question of counsel is an insult to the court in seeking to instruct the court on law matters through the mouth of an Indian," asserted Judge Carland with considerable warmth of feel-

The testimony was concluded before Judge Carland in the United States circuit court yesterday at 4:30 p. m., with the defendant as the last witness. District At-torney Baxter then began his argument soon adjournment was taken to this morning. A motion was made by the attorneys for the defense that the court instruct the jury to find a verdict of not guilty on the hypothesis that the accused was not an Indian and that consequently the court had no jurisdiction in the case. The motion was promptly overruled

Line of Denfense. The whole line of defense is to prove that Henry Guitar is not an Indian and repeated motions and objections have been made by the defense to establish this fact, bit in each instance the motions and objections have been overruled. The essential point sought to be established by the defense is that tribal relations do not ex-Ist on the Omaha Indian reservation and that the murdered Stephen Guitar was not an Indian, at least not more than a halfbreed, his Indian blood being that of the Pawnee race, he having been adopted in childhood by the Fontanelle family and Frank Roberts, Omaha. subsequently adopted into the Omaha tribe.
