SMALL BOY CONFESSES LARCENY

HUMBOLDT, Neb., Jan. 12.—(Special.)—Roy Allen, a 14-year-old school boy of this city, was found under arrest yesterday afternoon by Marshal Todd, a warrant having been sworn out by Mrs. Sara Grinstead charging that he had stolen her gold watch, valued at \$45, from her home on December 31. The youth steadfastly denied all knowledge of the missing article and was locked up in the city jail. The time for his hearing was set for 5 o'clock in the afternoon and the hearing was postponed was put through a sweating process by the officer and prosecuting witness, finally acknowledging that he took the watch, but asserted that he had disposed of it by throwing it into the cess pool at the school grounds.

EXPLOSION WRECKS BUILDING

NORTH PLATTE, Neb., Jan. 13.—(Special.)—The fine residence of Dr. Dent of this city was partially wrecked this morning. The cause of the explosion was the pipes which had become frozen and burst. A fire had been started in the kitchen range, the water was turned on, and as soon as it came into the pipes in the range part of the water was turned to steam and on account of the great pressure the pipes exploded and blew the range all to pieces. One of the children barely escaped a piece of steel which passed with great force near her. The explosion was so terrific that the windows in that portion of the house were shattered and the door was blown open. This residence had just been completed a few weeks ago at a cost of several thousand dollars.

SETTLE WITH BRIDGE COMPANY

FAIRBURY, Neb., Jan. 13.—(Special.)—The county commissioners were in session yesterday and compromised their differences with J. W. Towle & Co. of Omaha. Last month Towle & Co. obtained from the district court a writ of mandamus directing the commissioners to award them the contract for highway bridges for 1905. Last week the commissioners notified the bridge firm that they were ready to sign the contract and Towle & Co. refused to sign the same, whereupon the board declared the \$600 deposited by the former forfeited and advertised for new proposals. The matter was settled by Towle & Co. paying the costs of the mandamus suit and the advertising and receiving the balance of their deposit.
