EMPEROR RECEIVES KOSSUTH

Leader of Hungarian Independents Visits the Hofburg Palace. MARKS BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA

Son of the Great Patriot Outlines the Policy of His Party for the Information of the Sovereign.

VIENNA, Feb. 12.—Francis Kossuth, the leader of the independent party in the Hungarian Parliament, was received this morning by the emperor king and discussed with him the political situation.

Herr Kossuth has declared that it is impossible now to govern Hungary without the help of this united party, or against its wishes.
