EMPEROR RECEIVES KOSSUTH

Leader of Hungarian Independents Visits

the Hofburg Palace.

MARKS BEGINNING OF A NEW ERA

Son of the Great Patriot Outlines the Policy of His Party for the Information of the

VIENNA, Feb. 12 .- Francis Kossuth, the easer of the independent party in the Hundrian Parliament, was received this morning by the emperor king and discussed with his majesty the political situation and cabinet crisis in Hungary arising from the coalition of the various minor partles in Hungary with the independent party and the sweeping victory at the polls on January 28, which has re-sulted in the united opposition parties being placed in control of the lower house of the Hungarian Parliament,

Herr Kossuth has declared that it is impossible now to govern Hungary without the help of this united party or against its wishes. Herr Kossuth was with his majesty nearly an hour and was treated with great distinction. He expressed fully his views and his party's views. The emperor listened attentively but did not make any reply affecting the situation. If Kossuth stands fast for his party's program his position is a strong one, and it is believed that he will do so. The solution of the present situation may be delayed, but it is hoped that the emperor's approaching visit to Buda Pest, where he will confer with other Hungarian leaders, will do nuch to help find the solution.

Herr Kossuth returned to Buda Pest this afternoon. While he was loudly cheered going to and from the Hofburg by some hundreds of adherents he had to dissuade his followers from making any bolsterous demonstrations. His quiet demeanor created a favorable impression. He declined to reveal anything the emperor said in the course of the audience, but declared himself deeply moved and charmed by the emperor's gracious amiability, adding that the emperor showed himself well informed on the whole situation in Hun-
