St. Paul Man Rolls 651 Points in American Bowling Tourney.

TAKES FIRST PLACE FROM CHICAGO

Stretch and Roll of the Windy City Still Lead in the Two-Men Team Contest at Milwaukee.

MILWAUKEE, Feb. 24.—Chicago lost its grip on one of the national championships in the bowling tourney of the American Bowling Congress today when C. M. Anderson of St. Paul rolled 651 points and overhauled Otto Kuyper, score 628. Anderson bowled a steady game from start to finish, his score by games being 205, 230, 215. Several other changes in the standing of the men in the front rank were brought about in today's play. The leaders in the two-men division remain in the same position as last night, with Stretch and Roll of Chicago at the top.
