

NELSON WINS IN THE NINTH

Young Corbett Unable to Withstand the Terrible Battering of the Bano.

HIS SECONDS THROW UP THE SPONGE

Earlier Rounds Were in Favor of the Former Champion, but the Pace Was Too Swift for Him.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 28.—Battling Nelson of Chicago defeated Young Corbett, former welterweight champion of the world, tonight in the ninth round of what was to have been a twenty-round fight.

Between 4,000 and 5,000 people witnessed the spectacle and it is estimated the receipts will approximate \$15,000.

For the first time in his "hate" career Nelson entered the ring a favorite in the betting, the result apparently of his previous victory over the ex-lightweight champion. The odds were 10 to 5 in his favor.

Round 1.—Corbett danced about, looking confident, while Nelson wore a more serious air. Corbett continued to dance for a minute, trying to draw Nelson out. Then he quickly shot a straight right over the head and missed a second wild and a straight right landed high on Nelson's chest.

Round 2.—Nelson crouched low. Corbett waded in, mixing it freely, but Nelson landed. He kept at close quarters, Corbett landing left and right, short arm rights being the feature.

Round 3.—They sparred carefully. Finally Corbett bored in, trying left for the face, but was blocked. Nelson swung right and left to the body as Corbett was trying to work the head.

Round 4.—Corbett waded right in and planted his left hand on Corbett's face and Corbett's right hand on Nelson's nose. Corbett's right hand landed on Nelson's nose and Corbett's left hand on Nelson's forehead.

Round 5.—They went to close quarters immediately. Nelson then chased Corbett about the ring, but Corbett drew him to a clinch. Corbett swung twice with left to the head.

Round 11.—Nelson Corbett uppercut with left to the chin. Nelson swung twice right for the head. Nelson kept boring in, forcing Corbett to the ropes.
