PLACE OF DETENTION FOR BOYS

Probation Officer Bernstein Has No Place to Incarcerate Any Who Are Recalcitrant.

What to do with juveniles when it is necessary to lock them up is a question which is claiming the attention of "Moggy" Bernstein. He now has nine on parole and the number will increase rapidly. The juvenile court law provides that child prisoners shall not be detained in the same place with adults, and "Moggy" is unwilling to allow any child to be taken to the police station even for a day. Yet he is at a loss to know what to do under present conditions if a parole should be violated.

Mr. Bernstein says that the judges of the juvenile court will appear before the Board of County Commissioners Saturday and ask them to provide at once a place of detention. Two such places are needed, for the law does not allow those who have been delinquent through thoughtlessness to be locked up with those who have committed criminal offenses.

Turned Over to Bernstein.

Emil Valine, charged with cutting Ed Flood on the night of March 4, has been turned over to the juvenile court. Police Judge Berka having decided, after perusal of a copy of the new law, that he has no jurisdiction in the case. The matter has been hanging fire in police court for more than a week, on account of delay in securing certified copies of the law. It was a question whether or not Judge Berka has jurisdiction in felony cases.

PAVING WAITS ON WEATHER

North Sixteenth Street Job Will Not Be Touched for Some Time.

The unfinished North Sixteenth street paving, from Webster to Izard streets, is to be laid as soon as the city engineering department thinks the weather warrants ordering construction. The matter has been taken up by the council and instructions given to start the work at once, but in the public works department it is held that it would be folly to try to put down asphalt paving so early in the year with constant danger from freezing and washouts. Therefore it has been decided to hold back the orders to the Barber Asphalt company from fifteen to thirty days, and possibly longer.

Irate because she believed her husband to be paying attentions to a colored woman, Mrs. McGraw called into a Cuming street saloon after "her man Mike" and began to trace geometric figures before his face with an ugly butcher knife.
