## SNYDER WILL GO SCOT FREE

Self-Confessed Perjurer a Man of Weak Mind and Unfit for Further Punishment.

The report of A. W. Jeffers and T. J. Mahoney in the Alva Snyder case has been verbally submitted to Judge Munger, and the incident virtually closed. The report was, in effect, that it was perfectly clear that the witness, Snyder, had been tampered with by Luthardt, Ennis, Randall and others during the Ennis and Luthardt trial, and Snyder had received assurances from them that he would be taken care of if he would repudiate the testimony he made against them. The investigation further discloses the fact that Snyder is a man of rather weak mental caliber and was completely under the domination of Luthardt, Ennis and Randall, and that he had been filled with whisky, and through threats and intimidation was persuaded to perjure himself. Snyder confessed to the investigating committee that his first statement before

Judge Baxter was the true one and that he had been coerced into committing perjury, but the fact still remained that he was perfectly willing to be coerced.

The conclusion eventually reached in the matter is that, owing to the absolutely irresponsible character of the witness and his weak mentality, it would be simply a miscarriage of justice to proceed further in the matter. Snyder was bound over to the federal grand jury in the sum of \$2,000 to answer for the charge of perjury, and was later released on his own recognizance.

### The Rise of the Automobile.

That the automobile has steadily grown in favor is shown by the records at Albany, N. Y. No doubt the rate of increase for New York represents that of other states. The first of the machines was registered April 26, 1901, while the number recorded March 1 of this year was 15,574. At the end of the first year there were 1,000 operated in the state; a year later the number was 2,087, and last year there were 9,985. John Jacob Astor has owned twenty-two and William K. Vanderbilt, Jr., fourteen.
