

OMAHA WINS SECOND GAME

Champions Break Losing Streak and Stop Des Moines' Mad Rush.

CLOSE GAME FULL OF FIRST CLASS BALL

Companion Serves for Omaha Against Manske in a Battle of the Southpaws at Vinton Park.

Although the Des Moines team made more hits and fewer errors, they were unable to connect at the time when hits meant runs and the Champions annexed the second game of the series by the score of 4 to 3. Companion was put in to oblige for Pa and he did well, allowing but six hits, although he passed six to first. Mike Cantillon trotted out his outstrip, Manske, whom he had borrowed from Milwaukee, but it proved him naught, for the local slugger got four hits, which proved enough to win the game. Fans who were brave enough to face the chances of the grip and pneumonia and such things were amply rewarded by seeing a game that was full of interest from the start to finish.

Des Moines was blanked in the first, although Hoggie singled. He was caught trying to steal second. For Omaha Tiel walked and Carter sacrificed him down to second. Welch flew out and Dolan walked. Thomas hit safe and Tiel scored. In the sixth inning when the smoke was cleared away, three tallies were added to the Omaha column. Welch struck out and Dolan singled, and then proceeded to steal second. Thomas was given a life on Casey's error and Hoggie advanced. Thomas scored a moment later on Martin's pretty single to leftfield. Just to show a little speed and incidentally to score the run that won the game Martin stole second and on the next pitched ball stole third. He led off and excoated a throw from Manske, and scored when the latter threw the ball into the bleachers. This ended the run getting for Omaha.

Des Moines' Desperate Stand. In the sixth inning the Cantillons commenced to climb, but the one run they made each inning for the next three times up left them one short of a tie. Seven men faced Paulerino in the sixth and still they crossed the plate but once. Hoggie walked and a Texas leaguer from the bat of Frisbee advanced him to second. Rossmann bunted to Companion, who caught Hoggie at third with a toss of the ball to Tiel Willie Schipke. Casey was retired from Martin to Thomas and Steele walked. A single by Flek scored Frisbee and Wakefield, who was put in to bat for Trow, could do nothing. Manske was allowed to perch on first on the opening play of the next inning by an error of Dolan's. He was doubled up on the next ball pitched, when Ganley drove it to Martin, who ran to touch Manske, but the latter ran out of line and Martin threw the ball to first in time to catch Ganley. Hoggie, who seemed to act as captain, rushed to the center of the diamond and tried to bite a chunk out of the umpire, but Mike Cantillon called him to the bench and the fun continued. Hoggie went around to third when Bill Schipke threw the ball into the bleachers and scored on a wild pitch.

For the last run Steele doubled and came home late on Wakefield's single. One of the most striking plays of the day was a run that Dr. Welch made for a short drive from the bat of Ganley in the fifth inning, when Trow was on second and a hit meant a tie score. Welch went after it just as if he was playing foot ball, and when he saw that he could not reach the ball on the run he made a flying tackle and pulled it right off the ground.

Burns Starts Trouble. Umpire Burns nearly precipitated a riot in the last inning when he called Frisbee safe on first. The ball was batted to Ship, who fielded it clean and made a pretty throw to Thomas. The ump insisted that Thomas had his foot off the bag.
