

KINKAID LAW ACTS AS REFUGE

New Statute on Homesteading Enables Land Fencers to Secure Postponement.

INDICTMENTS MUST BE READJUSTED

Such is the Assertion of Assistant District Attorney Lane in Referring to Further Prosecution.

Assistant United States District Attorney Lane said Tuesday morning in reference to the further trial of the land fencing cases at this term of the federal court: "It is probable there may be no further trials of these cases during the May term. The reasons for this are that most of the indictments were brought prior to the enactment of the Kinkaid law, and as vast tracts of land hitherto under illegal fence have been formally entered under that law, the indictments would have to be readjusted to meet the new conditions. We could hardly afford to go to trial without some assurance of a conviction. The indicted parties might say, it was true they did have lands under fence that were a part of the public domain, but since then they had acquired the land under the Kinkaid law, and it is extremely doubtful whether a jury could convict under those circumstances. Consequently, on this very ground was a continuance secured in the Barrett-Richards cases.

Must Make New Surveys.
"New surveys will have to be made in order that the Department of Justice can make absolutely sure of its premises. The three special agents of the land department, DeFrees, Nixon and Chambers, are now in the field looking after these surveys and securing new evidence. It will be largely from this new evidence that the grand jury at November will be called upon to act. Yet we propose to go right along with the work and will bring civil action against the parties illegally enclosing public lands, and if the fences are not taken down within the time prescribed criminal action will be brought. The processes will be in the nature of injunction proceedings and we will not have to await the action of the grand jury in such cases. The instructions from the Department of Justice are to proceed with the work and require the removal of the fences at the earliest practicable moment, either by legal proceedings or by force if necessary."
