

INSANE SEEKING HUSBAND

Woman Flies Search from Ohio and is Demented on Arriving Here.

MISSING MAN OUT OF CITY AT WORK

Wife Relates Incoherent Tale to His Employers and Police, Who Take Her in Charge.

After worrying nearly a month over the fortunes of her husband and feeling herself unable longer to live without his companionship, Mrs. Rachel Briggs of Toledo, O., made the long trip to Omaha in search of him, only to arrive in a demented condition and to find her husband at least temporarily out of the city.

Mrs. Briggs appeared at the police station Saturday morning and demanded of Captain Mostyn that she be allowed to see her husband. The officer asked her a few questions and determined very quickly the woman was not in full possession of her right mind. She told a strange and incoherent tale of misfortune and abuse.

The woman was placed in the charge of Police Matron Anderson and will be cared for until her husband is found or she recovers her sanity. She is quite well along in years.

From Mrs. Briggs' story and the investigations that Captain Mostyn has been able to make he thinks that Briggs left his former home at 1423 Milwaukee street, Toledo, and came west because he had become involved in the coils of loan agents and installment houses. It appears his full name is Peter Snyder Franklin Briggs and he secured employment as a grading boss or foreman with the Owens-Loveland Contracting company, with offices at 29 Barker block, under the name of Frank Snyder. He was sent out to handle a job on the Union Pacific, but has not reported for several days and the firm does not know his exact whereabouts. He wrote to a wife in Toledo and proved to be a capable grading man.

Before coming to the police station Mrs. Briggs called at the contracting firm's office and told much the same incoherent story that she did at the police station.
