Disasters Early Morning Blaze in the Ogden Livery Barn.

ONLY SEVEN HEAD IN THE STABLE SAVED

Fire Thought to Have Been Started by Some Tramps Who Were Sleeping in the Hay Mow Shortly Before Fire Started.

Sixteen head of horses were either burned to death or suffocated in a fire which partially destroyed the Ogden livery at 128 West Broadway early yesterday morning.

The origin of the fire, which started in the hay mow, is unknown. About midnight the stablemen turned out two tramps who had sought a sleeping place in the hay and the supposition is that one of them may have dropped the lighted end of a cigar or cigarette which started the hay.

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WEAVER WILL PROSECUTE

Philadelphia District Attorney Refuses to File Charges Against Graters.

MAYOR WILL TAKE INDEPENDENT ACTION

Root, McVeagh, Gordon and Other Prominent Attorneys Advise This Action—Officials Who Are Under Fire.

PHILADELPHIA, Pa., July 17.—As a result of advice received from EHU Root, counsel for Mayor Weaver, it is probable that the mayor will within a few days institute criminal prosecution against certain attorneys having refused to do so.
