ALLOWANCES TO ELEVATORS

Commerce Commission Investigating Complaints of St. Louis Grain Men.

CHARGE DISCRIMINATION AGAINST CITY

Allege that Omaha and Kansas City Are Given an Unfair Advantage—Railway Traffic Men Examined.

ST. LOUIS, July 22.—The elevator allowance question, which is deemed one of vital importance to St. Louis grain dealers, received an exhaustive hearing by the Interstate Commerce commission today.

The hearing was brought about by complaints of the transportation committee of the Merchants' exchange of St. Louis. The St. Louis grain dealers claim that the elevator allowances alleged to be granted at Kansas City and Omaha, but not in St. Louis, constitute an unfair discrimination.

Asked permission to blank by the commissioners what they thought should be done, nearly all the witnesses stated that the elevator allowances should be either abolished or so adjusted that all cities could benefit by them, and be placed upon an equal basis in doing business.

Says Custom Started in Omaha. C. Crosby, freight traffic manager of the Burlington road, testified that the Burlington Railroad company is not in favor of concessions, but has to make them because competing lines do.

Discrimination Against Chicago. George F. Marcy of the Armour Grain company, Chicago, and president of the Southwestern Elevator company, Kansas City, stated that the elevator allowances were detrimental to the grain trade.

Chicago, he declared, was discriminated against with the result that business is being diverted from there.
