Minter won this heat by half a length from Pat T. In the last event of the afternoon, the \$200 pace, the favorite, Don Carr, was defeated. Geary took the lead at the quarter in the first and kept it in the second and third. The second heat produced the best finish of the afternoon. Geary led to the home stretch, where Don Carr shot into the lead and held it for seventy-five yards. Then Miss Willmont came with a tremendous rush, and seventy-five yards from the wire took the lead from Don Carr and won the heat by half a length. Miss Willmont repeated her burst of speed in the stretch in the third heat, in which Geary led until the last eighth of a mile. The track was in excellent condition and about 5,000 people saw the day's racing. The summaries:
