Ephraim Wright is New Hampshire's foremost opponent of race suicide. He is 87, and when a reporter called on him at his cottage in Acworth he was playing with his 17-month-old son, who crowed joyously on his knee.

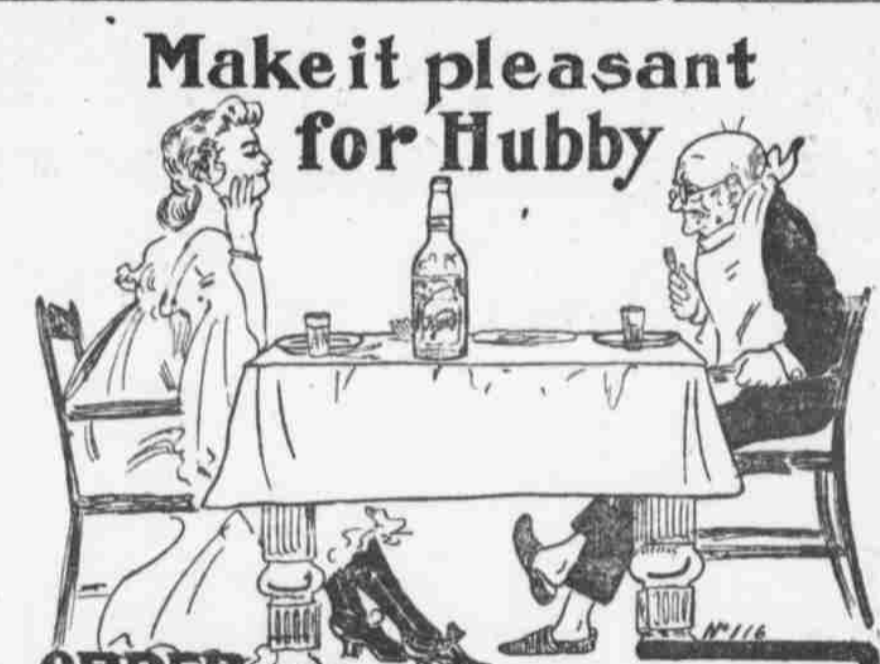
