

OMAHA SECOND CORN MARKET

Gate City Still Holds Place Next to Chicago for World.

FREIGHT RATES AFFECT LATE SHIPMENTS

For Seven Months Ending with July Corn Receipts Here Amounted to Nearly Eleven Million Bushels.

Omaha still holds its place as the second primary corn market of the country, as shown by the last report of the government bureau of statistics, department of commerce and labor.

For the seven months ending with July, corn receipts at Omaha were 10,757,000 bushels. In the same period Chicago received 9,861,373 bushels, and Omaha's next competitor, St. Louis, received 9,443,570 bushels.

Omaha and Council Bluffs.

Receipts of grain at Omaha and Council Bluffs during the month of July reached a total of 1,313,000 bushels, and were nearly 1,000,000 bushels larger than a like movement in 1904.

Receipts of grain from Omaha during the first seven months of the present year totaled 15,868,000 bushels, and were nearly double a corresponding movement in 1904.

July receipts were 144,000 bushels of wheat, as compared with 281,000 bushels last year.

Changes in Freight Rates.

The government report mentions changes in railroad freight rates, affecting Omaha, as follows:

From July 2 to August 25, 1905, a number of important changes occurred in grain and provision rates from interior primary points to Atlantic and Gulf ports.
