RUSSIA NOW READY TO ACT

In Bash Light is Announcement of Peace Conference Held in Washington.

DESIRED TO WAIT UNTIL AFTER END OF WAR

Specific Date for Meeting of Conference Will Be Fixed After All Powers Definitely Accept Invitation.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 19.—"It seems to the president that the high task undertaken in seeking to bring about an agreement of the powers to meet in a second peace conference is virtually accomplished so far as it is appropriate for him to act, and that, with the general acceptance of his invitation in principle, the future conduct of the affair may fitly follow its normal channels. To this end it is suggested that the further necessary interchange of views between the signatories of the acts of 1899 be effected through the international bureau under the control of the permanent administrative council of The Hague."

These words of the late John Hay, written December 18 last, as an instruction to the representatives of the United States accredited to the government's signatory to The Hague convention embody the last official action of this government looking to a reconvention of The Hague conference, according to the records of the State department, on October 19, 1904. Secretary Hay, by direction of the president, invited the powers to a second conference, fixing a date and suggesting an exchange of views as to the subjects to be considered. It was distinctly stated that the invitation was tentative. The exchanges soon followed and on December 15 of the same year Secretary Hay wrote:

The replies so far received indicate that the proposition has been received with general favor. No dissent has been found. The replies of Japan and Russia conveyed in like terms a friendly recognition of the proposition. The Netherlands, on the other hand, has declined to accept the invitation, but on the part of Russia the reply was accompanied by the statement that the imperial government at this moment is unable to accept a conference of this nature. The replies so far received indicate that the proposition has been received with general favor. No dissent has been found.
