**KUGEL UP AGAINST PUZZLE**  
Plumbing Inspector Finds No Way to Enforce New Law.

TOO MANY WAYS OF EVADING IT  
Ordinance Enacted Last June May Be Put Up to the Courts for Some Sort of Disposition.

City Plumbing Inspector Kugel is puzzled as to how to enforce an ordinance passed in June which has this section in it: "It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to engage in the plumbing business in the city of Omaha without having an established place of business in said city and without having first secured from the building inspector a master plumber's general permit."

The law was passed at the request of local plumbers, which alleged they were barred out of South Omaha by a similar ordinance there. This was disputed by South Omaha plumbers and overtures made to secure a double repeal of the clause in the ordinances of both cities. This arrangement has not been carried out.

Two ways were discovered by South Omaha and other foreign plumbers to get around the law. The first was to do Omaha jobs under the general permit issued to some local plumbing firm, paying the firm a commission on the job for the privilege. This deal pleased the Omaha concerns and they made no objection to letting all the outside plumbers that wished come in here, provided they got a percentage on jobs.

What Latest Method Is.  
The latest method, however, is for the outsider to procure desk room, real or imaginary, some place in Omaha, call it his "established place of business," and proceed to rake in as many jobs as possible under it. The plumbing inspector was fully aware of this kind of evasion, but was unable to see how he could stop it. Later on the outside plumbers declared their place of business wherever they happened to be working, gave it as their business address, and in the case of one big downtown building, claimed to have an office in the basement.

Considerable doubt exists at the city hall as to the legality of the embargo section and this has deterred the inspector from attempting a radical enforcement. Resident plumbers are complaining on the ready-made "established place of business," however, and it is likely that the law will be submitted to the courts for a decision before long.
