#### KUGEL UP AGAINST PUZZLE

Enforce New Law.

Ordinance Enacted Last June May Be Put Up to the Courts for Some Sort of

Disposition,

City Plumbing Inspector Kugel is puzzled as to how to enforce an ordinance passed in June which has this section in it:

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm preorporation to engage in the plumbing business as a master or contracting plumber in the city of Omaha without having an established place of business in said city and without having first secured from the building inspector a master plumber's general permit.

Officers of the republican county committee are looking for suitable rooms for campaign headquarters. Active work will not be retarded, however, by any delay in getting proper quarters. Chairman Gibson and Secretary Greevy have announced that

The law was passed at the request of local plumbing firms, which alleged they were barred out of South Omaha by a simiar ordinance there. This was disputed by South Omaha plumbers and overtures made to secure a double repeal of the clause in the ordinances of both cities. This arrange-

ment has not been carried out. Two ways were discovered by South Omaha and other foreign plumbers to get around the law. The first was to do Omaha jobs under the general permit issued to some local plumbing firm, paying the firm they made no objection to letting all the outside plumbers that wished come in here, provided they got a percentage on jobs.

What Latest Method Is. The latest method, however, is for the outsider to procure desk room, real or imaginary, some place in Omaha, call it "established place of business," and proceed to rake in as many jobs as possible under it. The plumbing inspector was fully aware of this kind of evasion, but tery in all forms and in all stages. It never was unable to see how he could stop it. Later on the outside plumbers declared their place of business wherever they happened to be working, gave it as their business address, and in the case of one big downtown building, claimed to have an

office in the basement. Considerable doubt exists at the city hall as to the legality of the embargo section and this has deterred the inspector from attempting a radical enforcement. Resident plumbers are complaining on the ready made "established place of business," however, and it is likely that the law will be submitted to the courts for a decison before long.


