

### NEXT CONVENTION AT FRIEND

Thirty-Ninth Annual Meeting of State Baptist Association Goes There.

REV. E. R. CURRY PREACHES SERMON

Delegates in Omaha Resolve in Favor of Prohibition of the Liquor Traffic in State and Nation.

The Baptist state convention adjourned yesterday. Reports followed each other in quick succession at the morning session. Though the board of managers had been in session until after midnight considering the many applications for aid in the support of missionary pastors, nevertheless when Dr. J. W. Conley called the convention to order most of the delegates were in their places and ready for a busy day.

The committee on next anniversaries, Rev. A. H. Ballard, York, chairman, reported that the church at Friend, having just completed a new building, had sent in a cordial invitation for the convention next year. It was voted that the invitation be accepted and the next meeting will therefore be held at Friend early in October, 1906.

The enrollment committee reported that 28 delegates and visitors were present and the convention continued the committee until the close of today's session in order that delegates arriving today may be included.

Rev. E. R. Curry of Omaha was elected to preach the annual sermon at Friend next year and Rev. B. S. Hudson of Hastings alternates. The missionary sermon will be by J. W. Merrill of Nebraska City, with Rev. C. J. Pope of Grand Island as alternates.

#### Resolutions Adopted.

The resolutions presented by Rev. G. L. Conley of Blair were adopted as they came from the committee:

That we congratulate the convention and its committee on pulpit support upon the large number of well equipped pastors who have been led to settle among us.

That we rejoice in the fact that we have put forth through the Home Mission society to awaken the true spirit of evangelism in the churches, and that we are grateful for the spirit of cooperation manifested by the pastors of the state in visiting time from their work for a well-organized, efficient and speedy field.

That our pastors preach more frequently on God's ownership of property, the necessity of which is very apparent.

That we express our sincere gratitude for the marked progress of Grand Island college.

That we reiterate our oft declared pronouncement in favor of the prohibition of the liquor traffic for the individual. The license system is vicious in principle and powerless as a deterrent.

That we express our sincere gratitude to the First Baptist church and members of the other churches for the excellent entertainment so freely and bountifully provided us.

#### Influence of Education.

The annual statement of Dr. George Sutherland, president of Grand Island college, was read. Among other things he said:

"The influence of Baptists in the world will depend upon two things: First, the commanding and sanctified ability of the laymen; second, a sufficiently numerous and well-trained ministry."

Dr. Sutherland declared that half of the \$2000 needed for new buildings had been secured.

Mr. J. M. P. Heriman spoke from the standpoint of the student and gave an eloquent oration on the religious life of the college man.

Prof. F. Crawford told of opportunities for teachers which he and his fellow teachers found among the young people at Grand Island.

"Educational Opportunities of Nebraska Baptists" was the title of a strong address by Rev. E. R. Curry of Omaha. He said:

"The history of Grand Island college is short, but in its fruition educationally beyond our estimate. If its history is to be a prophesy of the future of its work, then great things are before it."

Mr. Curry advocated the building of a guild hall in nearness to the state university. He closed his appeal for Christian education by outlining the able work of Charles Hughes, who is conducting the examination of the high finance methods of insurance circles, and who took the first part of his college course at Colgate university and the latter part of his course at Brown university. As we go to press Dr. Shaler Matthews of Chicago university is speaking.
