WASHINGTON, Nov. 5.—Sixteen million dollars will be necessary to complete the engineering work of fortifications of the seacoasts of the United States under the plans of the Endicott board, according to the report of Brigadier General Alexander MacKenzie, chief of engineers. There has already been appropriated for this purpose \$25,000,000. Permanent projects at thirty-one different points have been adopted and most of them are well under way. These points are:
