

SHORTS TALKS OF CANAL

Head of Isthmian Commission Addresses Hardware Men's Convention. GIGANTIC OBSTACLES TO OVERCOME First Great Task is to Make the Zone Fit Place for Americans to Live.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 9.—Theodore P. Shonts, the chief of the Isthmian Canal commission, was the principal speaker at a joint meeting of the American Hardware Manufacturers' association and the National Hardware association at the New Willard tonight.

Mr. Shonts devoted his introductory remarks to a detailed account of what the commission has done towards rendering conditions at the isthmus so that Americans can live there.

While all this necessary work was in progress the task of purchasing, forwarding and distributing the enormous quantity of materials and supplies of all kinds was receiving our constant and most careful attention.

Sixty-one steam shovels, 1,300 floats, 15 rapid unloaders, 23 unloading piers, 13 earth spreaders, 24 pumps, 12 hoisting engines, 10 locomotives, 20 portable engines, 15,000 crates, 12,000 pieces of piling, 14 air compressing machines, 3 cranes, 15 rock drills, 30,000 feet of iron pipe, 100,000 feet of 1 1/2 inch pipe, 40,000 pounds of dynamite, 7,000,000 paving bricks, 5,000,000 building bricks, 50,000 square feet of floor tile, 35,000 barrels of cement, 3 steel water tanks and 200,000 feet of iron pipe.

To the various causes of delay mentioned it is to be added that the requirements of law that all bids for materials in use in government work shall be advertised. This compels a delay in all cases of from ten to thirty days.

TREPOFF WALKS THE PLANK

Witte and Omar Make Another Concession to Popular Demand. UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE IS GRANTED Constitutionalists Decide Not to Take Places in Cabinet Until After Meeting of the New National Assembly.

ST. PETERSBURG, Nov. 9.—(5:50 p. m.)—Both Count Witte and the emperor have made another concession. General Treppoff has been removed from the post of governor of the interior, and Russia's premier has agreed to immediate universal suffrage.

Count Witte has been fully aware of the intense hatred General Treppoff's retention in office was causing, but he never questioned the sincerity of the governor general's co-operation in the introduction of the new regime.

Universal Suffrage Granted. The series of consultations which Count Witte has been holding with constitutional demands, and even with the representatives of the conservative wing of the aristocrats, convinced him that it was useless to hold out longer if he was to continue seeking to secure the sympathy of the parties of the center.

REVOLT IS SPEEDILY QUELLED Garrison of Brazilian Fortress Makes Trouble, but Surrenders in a Short Time. RIO JANEIRO, Nov. 8.—The garrison of the fortress Santa Cruz at the entrance of the bay has mutinied. It is believed that the mutiny will be quickly suppressed.

GERMANS AT WORK AT MADEIRA

Operation of Company Claiming British Land Causes Unrest. LISBON, Portugal, Nov. 8.—The development of the island of Madeira by Germans is causing a sharp diplomatic incident. A German company under Prince von Hohenhausen, a nephew of the former chancellor, is making extensive improvements in the island and sought to secure land claimed by a British coal company which has a contract for the British admiralty to coal warships.
