

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

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CASH SITUATION PROVES VERY STRONG

Conditions at Minneapolis Help Op- tions—December Corn Stronger, While May is a Little Off— Foreign Markets.

OMAHA, Nov. 15, 1905.

Wheat showed a weaker sentiment today. The opening was strong at lower prices, but shortly the market fell off to about 5c below yesterday. Later the day's action on the strong cash situation in Minneapolis and the fact that the market closed at 86c, May at 85 1/2c and July at 85c.

December corn was a little stronger, while May showed a weaker sentiment. December closed at 47 1/2c, May at 45c, and July at 44c.

Primary wheat receipts were 1,430,000 bushels and shipments 1,000,000 bushels. Corn receipts were 800,000 bushels and shipments 600,000 bushels.

There was a big cash demand at Minneapolis, and wheat prices were firm. The market was strong at lower prices, but shortly the market fell off.
